1. Name of the College: Bharati College

### 2. Major activities and achievements:

One of the high points of this academic session has been the inauguration of the College Hostel by Dr. Satbir Bedi, Member Secretary, and Women's Commission on 17th December 2016. The Warden, Ms Himanshu Garg and 22 students have benefitting from its services from January 2017. Its stately imposing structure was given wide publicity during the College Union Fest which had it as its backdrop. It has well laid corridors, wash rooms, water coolers, solar panels for warm water. It has proved to be a warm welcoming space for hostlers. Hostellers also have the added advantage of availing the library, gym and sports facilities available in the college. There is an in-house doctor available for five days a week in the morning hours. The College is in the process of employing a nurse.

An **Academic Support Cell** and an **Outreach and Extension Cell** are the other key initiatives of the IQAC in the current year.

The Academic Support Cell has been supporting English Language Skills through the year and more recently it gives extra help in Mathematics and Economics to students who wish to prepare for competitive examinations.

The Outreach and Extension Cell under the guidance of Dr. Rekha Sapra initiated the 'Library Every Friday' program for providing free Library facilities to the children of Nirmal Chhaya. The college in collaboration with CFAR (Centre for Advocacy and Research) organized a Public Art show on 6th and 7th February, 2017 under OBR (One Billion Rising) campaign. The art exhibition brought together the creative outputs that had emerged from the various workshops that had taken place over the last year as part of a school project.
