The academic support cell of Bharati College has this unique feature was that instead of traditional pedagogy, the model of Peer Group teaching was followed. Students from B. A. (P) and B. Sc. (H) Mathematics conducted classes for students from different streams who needed guidance. A list of important topics for competitive exams was drawn up and the students were taught the tricks of doing fast calculations. The students were also suggested some short cut methods for solving complex mathematical problems. Many students enrolled for the course. It was mutually beneficial for the 'teachers' as well as the learners.

Under the able guidance of Dr. Saloni Gupta, NCWEB Centre has reached this height. Around 1100 students benefitted from 42 faculty members.
