'Redstockings Heroes': Volunteers Support Program for Children of Nirmal Chhaya



Under the 'Redstockings Heroes' initiative the society members engage in teaching and learning activities at Nirmal Chhaya. Redstockings Literary Society started its 'Hero's Initiative' on 26t September 2016 and coordinated with Ms. Anuradha at Nirmal Chhaya. The initiative was open to students of all the courses hence first year students from B.com (Hons) such as Himani Mallik, Shewta Rajput and Hitika Kaushik were a part of the group of fifteen volunteers who visited Nirmal

Chhaya thrice every week.. Devanshi Dabas from English (Hons.), Third year, lead the group. Under the initiative, the students were divided into 3 groups. The first group of students

interacted with the children of and under the age of 5. They taught them nursery rhymes and also played various games with them in an effort to bridge the communication gap of these children from the deprived sections with the outer world. The second group interacted with girl children above five years of age. Both the groups interacted and got involved in various art activities. Since Diwali was around the corner, the students got along in painting diyas and making posters. The third group had 2 students Devanshi Dabas and Yogita Rewalia helped in organizing the trips and monitored the other two groups. By the end of the month i.e. on 26th October 2016, a stall was put up in Nirmal Chhaya to sell the hand painted Diyas. Later, on 28th October 2016, the stall was also put up in Bharati College.

'Redstockings Heroes': Literary Afternoons with Senior Citizens



From this session the activities of the society has also extended to the good Samaritan domain. Students have taken initiative of holding 'Literary Afternoons' fortnightly at the Old Age home of Bindapur with a view to providing the neglected senior citizens the joy of celebrated stories and poetry, in a manner meant to make them feel happy and needed in their twilight years. The Society began its second 'Heroes Initiative' in the month of October. Under the initiative 10

students of English Department visited Old age home, Bindapur. All the activities were supervised by Mr. Charan Singh (Superintendent). The initiative was conducted for once a fortnight. The group of students was led by Devanshi Dabas, English (Hons.) 3rd Year. As the objective of the initiative was 'Literary Afternoons with Senior Citizens' the students were asked to prepare a prose or a poem that was to be read during the session. Poems written by various Indian writes such as Harivansh Rai Bachhan were particularly welcomed. The sessions helped in providing the senior citizens opportunity for interaction with young people offering literary discussions but took on a varied flavour as the senior citizens sang and shared their views on topics like religion and India Epics i.e. Mahabharata and Ramayana apart from their experiences, and about their families The students always received a warm welcome. The sessions stretched for 2 hours.

The Seminar ended with a talk and poetry reading session of Dr. by Yuyutsu RD Sharma, a widely travelled Nepalese poet of Indian origin whose poems stress the need for environmental conservation.
