College.



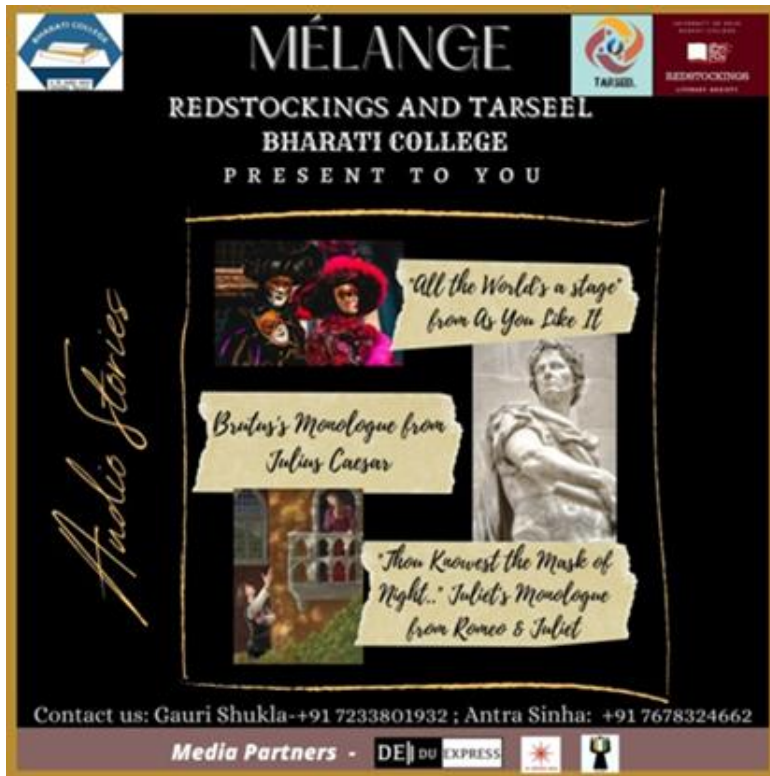
