









Self Defence Training Program






Research Workshop






CHINTAN-THE DEBATING SOCIETY 2022-2023 REPORT

And thereby giving the top 3 rankers accolades and cash prizes respectively. All the other participants were given Certificates of Participation.


3. CHINTAN Auditions

IQAC Details of E.O.C (June 2022-Aug 2023)

The E.O.C (Equal Opportunity Cell) has ensured a conducive environment for the growth of all the students especially taking into consideration the needs of the students with special abilities. The cell has effectively conducted webinars as well as physical seminar talks on various subjects related to the professional and personal growth and well-being of the PwD students. Talks on the awareness of the rights of PwD students, Self-Employment strategies for the PwDs and on various Employment opportunities for the PwDs were organised to sensitize both students and faculty members and to create an inclusive environment. Workshops on the effective and hands-on use of various reading devices were conducted for the students with special abilities.

Besides talks and enabling devices for the PwDs, care has also been taken with regard to their navigation within the institution. Special facilities like Signage in from of classrooms, ramps for easy access to classrooms, disability-friendly washrooms etc, have been some of the facilities that have been provided to create a conducive and inclusive environment. The students with special abilities have also been given facilitated with an extra hour during exams period to complete their exams. They are also allowed to bring a writer of their choice to write for them during exams. The details of the events organised by the cell are as follows:

A. Workshop on Gender Sensitization

The Equal opportunity Cell, Bharati College organised a Gender Sensitization Workshop on 10th February, 2023. The Speakers of the session were Prof. Rekha Sapra, Principal, Bharati College and Dr. Punita Gupta, Associate professor, Aditi Mahavidyalaya.

Prof. Sapra began her talk by focusing on the term "Gender Sensitization". She talked about the difference between the term "gender" and "sex" and emphasized on the idea of "awareness" about the gender-based barriers that society imposes on women. The speaker pointed out that gender has always been a constructed subject by the society at large and it needs deconstructing.





The gender roles are stereotypical representations which has been set ever since the inception of the society and it continues to act as a deterrent to the progress of society. She emphasizes on the need to be "aware" as change has to be taken into consideration.

The second speaker i.e. Dr. Punita Gupta took the discussion of "Gender-sensitization" to another level wherein she emphasized on the realm of psychology as the defining factor of one's gender identification. She posited that "Gender" has to do with how we think, how we feel and what we believe we can or cannot do because of socially defined concepts of masculinity and femininity. She mentions that gender relates to positioned women's

relationship to each other and that it is nothing but a "social fabrication" on the biology of human beings.

She touched on the main idea that even before we go into the discussion of "gender sensitization" we have to actually understand the concept of what is "Gender issue" exactly? She points out that in order to analyse the issues on gender, one has to "see what our eyes have been trained not to see". We practice what we have been stereotypically been told to see.

She points out that "Empowerment" is within us and it is not something that one will be given. One of the stepping stones to empowerment is ---understanding that one is allowed to exercise one's choices and can freely do so in one's own terms.

The Academic Support Cell held classes every week. Students personally texted and expressed how *Sahyog* helped them and they could learn so much while attending these classes.



The Act has been instrumental in providing a robust justice mechanism for the victims of sexual abuse and has highlighted the significance of child rights and safety. The reporting of cases of child sexual abuse has also surged as a consequence of awareness. The Act covers punishment for both non-penetrative sexual assault and aggravated penetrative sexual assault.

Legal Aspects of Women Empowerment and Leadership


CONDUCTED BY AREYA- The Leadership Cell in collaboration with Internal Compliant Committee (ICC)


market developments, lack skills, and are not prepared for campus interviews thus making them unemployable.

So, in order to address the above issue Bharati College partnered with Youth4Jobs foundation to open up avenues for Students with Disability at the college level. The participated companies include Cappemini, Infosys BPM, Amazon, Cognizant, Barclays, HSBC. The corporate companies talked about their inclusion processes, jobs, and career progression in their organizations.

F. Online Webinar

An Online webinar talk on "Assisting Indian Laws for PwDs and sensitization to each other" was organised on the eve of World Disability Day on 1st December 2021 at 4-5 pm. The talk was given by senior advocate Mr. S.K Rungta and he apprised and sensitized all the students and faculty members on the rights of students with disability and the need to create an inclusive environment.

The session sensitized the Students, Teaching and Nonteaching staff of Bhararti College regarding 'The Rights of Persons with Disabilities (RPwD) Act. The Act was notified on December 28, 2016. Under the act, the principles stated



to be implemented for empowerment of persons with disabilities (PWD) are respect for inherent dignity, individual autonomy including the freedom to make one's own choices, and independence of persons. The Act lays stress on non-discrimination, full and effective participation and inclusion in society, respect for difference and acceptance of disabilities as part of human diversity and humanity, equality of opportunity, accessibility, equality between men and women, respect for the evolving capacities of children with disabilities, and respect for the right of children with disabilities to preserve their identities. The Ministry responsible for the implementation of the Act is the Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities (Divyangjan), Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment, Government of India.

Activities for 2023 by HDFE Department

Toy making and Storytelling workshop: The department of HDFE organized a toy making and story-telling workshop on 3rd February'23. 

Report on visit to National Archives of India, New Delhi



Students from third semester of History Department visited to National Archives of India on September 26, 2022. It was a part of educational visit and was led by Dr. Mithilesh Kumar Mishra, Mr. Anas Zaman, and Ms. Meenakshi Dabas. Permission to visit was requested beforehand via email from the Archive. All students were asked to congregate close to main entrance gate of the Archive at 10 a.m. They were given basic instructions, such as to maintain decorum and refrain from using cell phones in the premises of the Archive. After that attendance was recorded on the attendance sheet.

The National Archives of India is a place where the nation's rich and vivid documentary heritage is preserved. Here records are cared and looked after. People come here to gather firsthand facts, datas, and evidences ranging from letters, reports, photographs, and the other primary sources. The three essential duties of the Archive are custody, care, and consultation of records.

There are many documents could be found in the National Archive. It include records of pre-colonial, colonial and post-colonial period. These records are preserved scientifically by the Archivists in different sections. The cartographic section include map of various places of the sub-continent made at different time. Some rare manuscripts like Shahnama, Jog Bashisht, Akbarnama, Muntakhab ul- tawarikh and many more are preserved in the orientalist section. Private papers of well-known individuals are preserved in the private section, including those of Mahatma Gandhi, Dr. Rajendra Prasad, Sarojini Naidu, Dr. B.R. Ambedkar, and many others.

Students were introduced to repositories, cinematheque, conservation research laboratory with the assistance of an archivist. Archivist practically shown and explained the methods to preserve the archival records. These include providing a stable environment for records, using safe handling and storage methods, copying potentially fragile materials into a usable format (e.g. microfilming or digitization), storing records in housings made from stable materials (for example, document boxes made from "acid-free" paperboard), establishing a pest control program and instituting a disaster recovery strategy.

Students later departed to their home. They were also asked to prepare a report on their visit to the Archive. On the whole, it was a valuable learning opportunity for the students and the visit could be possible because of Prof. Rekha Sapra (Officiating Principal), Dr. Shakti Madhok (Teacher-in-charge) and the teachers who accompanied them.

Key highlights of the visit

- There are different sections where records are preserved.
 - > The cartographic section include maps of various places.

- > The private section include private papers of well known individuals.
- Repositories, cinematheque, conservation research laboratory were shown with the assistance of an archivist.
- The methods to preserve the archival records were practically shown and explained.
- Students later departed to their home in the evening.

Report on visit to National Museum, New Delhi



Students from third semester of History Honours were taken to the National Museum in New Delhi on 27 September, 2022. It was a part of educational visit led by Mr. Anas Zaman and Ms. Meenakshi Dabas. The students were instructed to congregate near the ticket counter located outside the gate of the museum at 10 a.m. Tickets were purchased by students themselves and the attendance was recorded on the attendance sheet.

The National Museum has an impressive collection of artefacts from across the subcontinent and the world. There are two buildings in the complex of National Museum: the Central building and the Buddha gallery. Within the complex, there are numerous Sculptures, Gateways, Ashokan edicts, and a magnificent Chariot made of saal wood.

The central building of museum has three floors. The ground floor consist of many galleries like that of Harappan Civilization (the collection here include potteries, seals, tablets, weights and measures, jewelleries, bronze and terracotta figurines and toys), Buddhist art (the collections represent Buddhist arts of Nepal, Tibet, Central Asia etc.), Mauryan and post-Mauryan gallery, Gupta and post-Gupta gallery, Indian Miniature paintings (these belong to major styles such as Mughal, Deccani, Rajput, Pahari, Central India and many other sub styles), Indian Scripts and decorative Art gallery. Galleries of Manuscripts, Coins, Central Asian antiquities and Tanjore and Mysore paintings are situated at first floor. The decorative arts and textile gallery is there at second floor, which include textiles and costumes, wood carving collections, musical instruments and dresses, paintings, and articles of

personal adornments of various tribal groups are there on display. There was also an exhibition of textile happening on same floor.

The Buddha Gallery is recently opened and is an added attraction in the museum. It is divided into several sections that depict various stages of Buddha's life from his birth to death. It has relics, specimen and antics dedicated to Buddha. Many come to pay homage to Buddha relics as these objects stimulate a sense of devotion.

In the evening, students later departed to their home. They were also asked to prepare a report on their visit to the museum. The museum visit was made possible with assistance from Prof. Rekha Sapra (Officiating Principal), Dr. Shakti Madhok (teacher-in-Charge) and the teachers who accompanied them. On the whole, it was an enriching learning experience for the students.
