Bharati College NCC Company consists of 320 cadets in 'A' & 'B' company. In the academic year 2015-16, 107 cadets were enrolled. Throughout the year cadets have been representing our college on different platforms and have brought many laurels to us.

In the beginning of the year, 02 cadets, namely, J.U.O. Monika Jha and Sgt. Sapna Prajapati were selected for Thal Sainik Camp and have successfully completed the training.

04 cadets of our college participated in the most prestigious Republic Day Camp out of which Cdt. Swati Singh successfully completed the camp, Cdt. Sweta participated till 2nd RDC selection and Cdt. Priya Rawat & Cdt. Swati participated till 1st RDC selection.

National Cadet Corps has introduced National Games as one of its main activities under organized championships in different games from past 2 years. This year Bharati College cadets participated in NCC National Games for Kabaddi, Kho-Kho, Athletic and Mass PT. The Kho-Kho team was declared the winner.

NCC

It is open to school and college students on voluntary basis a Tri-Services Organization, comprising the Army, Navy and Air Wing, engaged in grooming the youth of the country into disciplined and patriotic citizens.

COMBINE ANNUAL TRAINING CAMP July 2017

A 10 days Combine Annual training camp for NCC cadets from various districts commenced at the Delhi Cantt at DGNCC parade ground.The camp was organised by 5 DGBN.

Training was imparted to the cadets on various subjects such as drill, weapon training, map reading, first aid, self defense, military history, physical fitness, field craft, battle craft etc. Bharati clg cadets took part in drill competition, tug of war, culture in which we took 2nd position in drill competition and we won in tug of war.

Army Attachment Camp August 2017 :In this camp ncc cadets are given an opportunity to live and work in regular service units in the form of attachment training. A collation of vacancies for attachment to various Army command headquarters is done by the army headquarters. The attachment training is for approx 15 days duration. 2 days were selected for this camp during the above mentioned time period.

Advanced Leadership Camp September 2017: this camp are conducted every year on an all India basis. In this camp cadets are trained and taught by the highest ranking officer army and motivate them to take up career in Army. From Bharati College 2 cadets were selected for this incredible camp.

National Integration Camp (NIC)2017 : these camps are conducted on an all India bases and help bridge the cultural gap among various states of India. In addition, NCC conduct and NICs at remote and forward areas to promote national integration. Every year lots of cdt's selected in this camp. In 2017 there was 6 cadets who were get opportunity to attend this camp.

Prime minister's Rally January 2018 : the camp culminates in the Prime Minister's rally on 27 January every year which showcases of the activities of NCC. In 2017, there was 40 cadet's strength who took part in this high level camp.

ACTIVITIES:

NCC has adopted community development activities with the aim of imbibing amongst cadets selfless service to the community, dignity of labour, importance of self help, need to protect the environment, and to adjust weaker section of the society in their upliftment. This was envisaged through programmes involving adult education, tree plantation, blood donation, visit to old age homes, slum clearness, village upliftment and various other social schemes.

Tree plantation 2017 : NCC cadets plant sapling and look after them in conjunction with the concerned state departments. Approx 220 candidates were participated in this activity from Bharati College.

Blood donation November 2017 : cadets donate blood as volunteer service whenever needed by Hospital /Red cross. In 2017, the urgent requirement of the hospital was fulfilled by our NCC cadets, blood was donated by approx 70 to 80 cadets.

Clean India Green India February 2018: almost full strength of college participated in this activity and spread awareness between others people about cleaning of Streets, road, ponds , river etc.

AIDS Awareness Programme 2018 : NCC cadets participate actively in the AIDS awareness program and is working alongwith UNAIDS and DG AFMS in carrying out its awareness programs throughout the country. In 2017, a seminar was held based on this topic in which many cadets participated enthusiastically and many posters were also made on this topic and spread awareness to others by 150 ncc cadets of Bharati clg.

'B' & 'C' Certificate Exam 2018

These are open for the cadets who have attended requisite number of periods and camps during their training . Camps Attended :

Classes are conducted as per the given syllabus wherein certain aspects of NCC training are taught once again. The camp acts as a refresher training for the cadets and they are also trained in basic skills of survival and emergencies besides other topics. 150 cadets attended the camp at Carriappa Ground , Delhi Cantt.

International yoga day June 2018 -The International Day of Yoga has been celebrated annually on 21 June since 2015, following its inception in the United Nations General Assembly in 2014. Yoga is a physical, mental and spiritual practice which originated in India. 150 cadets performed yoga in CATC camp held at Carriappa Parade Ground , Delhi cantt.

Army Attachment Camp August 2018- These camps are conducted by the NCC in collaboration with Indian Army, as the willing cadets are attached to the specific regiments undergoing the training period of 10–15 days. In this camp, the cadets are trained by the instructors of the particular regiment, in the military tactics including day/night warfare & also get familiar with the weaponry. 2 Cadets were selected for the camp, the camp was held in New Delhi.

Advance Leadership Camp September 2018 is conducted 6 times in various places throughout India. A cadet must have completed Basic Leadership Camp in order to qualify for this camp. In this camp the officers give cadets training for SSB screening and entrance. 2 cadets were selected for this camp, the camp was held at Maulout, Punjab.

Army Wives Welfare Association (AWWA) October 2018 is one of the largest voluntary organisations in India. Year 2016 is the Golden Jubilee Year of AWWA. The fifty glorious years have been a saga of Army Wives braving all odds, standing in support of each other through testing times. In this, 15 cadets were selected and they performed in Manekshaw Auditorium.

National Integration Camp(NIC) December 2018 is to propagate national integration among cadets and society. 'Only the best cadets in drills and march are sent to represent their states.' This camp is considered for SSLC and higher secondary course(+2) grade mark. These camps are conducted on All India basis and help bridge the cultural gap among various States of India. 4 cadets were selected for this camp .

Ek Bharat Shrestha Bharat'2019 camp- The theme of this online EBSB is 'Yuva Shakti Se Aatmanirbhar Bharat Ka Nirman', which forms the backdrop of all the training. The main objectives of the camp is to develop leadership skills, enhance knowledge base and public speaking abilities, peer learning through mutual interaction, foster team spirit and esprit de corps, improve soft skills, understand culture of own state and the participating state. 20 cadets attended EBSB camp at different location.

Rock Climbing Training Camp February 2019 Eight rock climbing camps are held each year to expose the cadets to the basics of elementary rock climbing and to inculcate spirit of adventure amongst cadets. Four of these camps are held at Gwalior in Madhya Pradesh and other four camps at Nanyardam near Trivandrum in Kerala. 2 cadets were selected for this camp.

Prime Minister's Rally 28 January 2019– The Prime Minister's Rally, the most prestigious event of the NCC Republic Day Camp is held on 28 January every year. The PM's Rally commences with the Guard of Honour presented to Hon'ble Prime Minister by NCC Cadets. Cadets were selected for this on cultural basis. 30 cadets were selected for this camp. They performed in front of PM.

All India Trekking Expedition 2019 : 29 Trekking Expeditions are conducted annually with participation of 14500 Cadets from all State NCC Directorates. 4 Cadets were selected for this camp.

Parasailing January 28, 2019. Parasailing is conducted by the NCC Directorates giving cadets the thrill and experience of this adventure activity. SUO Deepika was selected for this camp.

NSS (National Service Scheme) Report 2015-16

From this year DU has specified following two activities to be conducted in every college under NSS

1. Cleanliness drive
2. Woman safety

Our students have actively participated in both of these activities cleanliness drive and women safety.

The College has installed 2 sanitary napkins vending machine for staff and students in washrooms to facilitate easy vending and disposing to support cleanliness drive.

The college has been declared as tobacco free zone and for this purpose four information boards have been put up in the college premises.

NSS Report 2016-2017



The National Service Scheme was launched in 1969 to bring into action Gandhiji's vision of service to the community by channelizing the energy and capabilities of students. It seeks to build student and teacher interaction through various activities and events. The motto of NSS 'Not Me But You' has been the practice amongst the students of Bharati

College. In the year 2016-2017 the students organized into volunteer groups and involved themselves in identifying and solving the problems faced by the community thereby developing a sense of social and civic responsibility.



The volunteers contributed their efforts to a clean India by undertaking the responsibility of keeping the college clean. To beat the fear of malaria and dengue during monsoon fumigation was planned and executed in the entire campus of the college with the help of MCD workers of the area. To sensitize the students on the ill effects of Drug Addiction, the issue was made the theme of deliberation for NSS Day 2016. The celebration began with a sapling plantation by the volunteers and principal of the college. An awareness rally of

about 100 volunteers, and activities like slogan writing competition and a Nukkad Natak conveyed the message 'Say No to Drugs'. The message of citizens responsibility to keep alive the democratic ethos was conveyed to the students by organizing Graffiti competition on the theme 'Matdata' on 6th and 20th October 2016. To spread the light of joy and happiness the NSS unit reached out to an NGO 'Antardrishti' to display their perfumed candles and incense sticks made by visually challenged and the Tihar Jail inmates. The students also exhibited their skills in making decorative items. These artefacts were displayed in the college.

The birth Anniversary of Sardar Vallabhai Patel was celebrated for a week as 'Rashtriya Ekta Saptah' from 31st October to 6th November 2016 marked by pledge of unity, integrity, security and service to the nation. Also, unity run, slogan writing, essay writing competitions and street plays were organized to spread the message of love and affection amongst fellow beings. Documentary films on Sardar Patel were screened in the seminar hall of the college. To reinforce the harmful effects of tobacco, display boards with captions- 'Tobacco free campus' have been put up in the premises.

The launch of Vittiya Saksharata Abhiyan (VISAKA) - a campaign for promoting a digital economy through youth volunteers by the Ministry of Human Resource Development many volunteers attended a workshop organized with the help of Punjab National Bank executives to apprise students of cashless mode of making payments. The aim of the workshop was to train the volunteers who would explain the benefits and advise people on using those modes in an effort to enable them to convert to digital payment mode. Volunteers covered the areas close to their residence to convince people or helping them to use such modes.

At the 21st National Youth Festival 2017 organized by Ministry of Youth & Sports, Government of India and Sports, & Youth Affairs Department, Haryana Govt., at Maharishi Dayanand University in Haryana's Rohtak District, from 12th to 16th January 2017 with the objective of 'Digital Young India', the college was represented by Renu Lata of B.Com final year.

A training programme on Emergency Response Preparedness was conducted by Smartpro Foundation on 31st January 2017 to develop capacity to meet emergencies and natural disasters. Society for Promotion of Youth and Masses (SPYM) organized 2nd National Youth Forum on Drug Use Prevention in Chanakya Puri New Delhi, our two volunteers attended the talk delivered by a speaker from AIIMS on the problems related **to alcohol and drugs consumption.**

The celebration of women empowerment began with a poster making competition on Beti Bachao Beti Padhao organized by Delhi Government. Participants from the college drew their thought on canvas to draw attention on the hitherto marginalized section of the society. Our volunteers also participated in 'Walk for Life' programme to stride against Cancer on 05th

This year too we invited an NGO Antardrishti to put up their products for sale and admire the beauty and novelty of the products made by visually challenged boys and girls. Volunteers gathered at the Indira Gandhi Stadium to save our depleting rivers. The call given by Sadhguru to save the dying rivers spread across 16 states for 30 days culminated on 2nd October 2107 in New Delhi with a pledge to rally for rivers urging the government to implement a positive river policy. One of the volunteers made a collage on the important cause and placards were distributed and the students were urged to give a missed call to register their votes thereby compelling the authorities to take immediate steps to save our rivers. To raise the concern of environment pollution due to fire crackers during Diwali time

the unit staged a nukkad natak 'Say No to Crackers', in the college as well as in the District Centre, Janak puri to sensitize the public on the harmful effects of burning crackers is to harm our health. Later in the day a human chain was formed with students holding placards outside the college to grab the attention of the passersby.

Earlier in July Janak Puri Election Commission made Voters electoral cards of the students, teaching and non-teaching staff of the college so far not enlisted in the voters list. A workshop was organized by NSS DU to highlight the importance of human values in a highly competitive world. The same was attended by two volunteers of NSS from the college. Volunteers also made an attempt to get selected for the Republic Day Parade. They participated in a day long sport events at the Chattrasal Stadium, Delhi. To uphold the ideals of Communal harmony the principal and staff of the college distributed stickers to each other of Communal unity thus reminding ourselves to respect the diverse and enriched culture of India and to join hands together for the progress of all. Yuva Diwas, National Youth Day was celebrated on 12th January 2018. Few volunteers chose

to speak on the ideals and philosophy of Swami Vivekanand thus pondering on the vision of Swamiji at a young age and with his bold speech delivered at the Worlds Parliament of Religion, Chicago leaving an everlasting impression on the world of an emerging young India. A documentary movie on the life and times of Swami Vivekanand was screened in the college.

The NSS unit conducted a ten day Self-defence training programme for the students with the help of Women Protection Cell, Delhi Police. More than hundred students got the training in self-protection from an untoward situation demanding urgent help. A volunteer from the college was selected to participate in the Khello India, an initiative started by the Government of India to motivate children to take sports as part of their routine. She was part of the sports presentation team and helped in executing various activities for the participants. A group of students teamed up at the Connaught Circus to form a human chain to show concern towards sexual exploitation and harassment of women. Two volunteers have been offered to avail the free digital library membership of the British Council for one year.

Volunteers have been regularly visiting the Shankar Garden slum adopted by the unit. They actively engage the kids in fun and learning games and activities. At times they have counselled adolescent girls on personal and oral hygiene. Students have been volunteering in college library, student union festival, department festivals. Few volunteers have been consistently volunteering as writers for students of x and xii to write their CBSE board exams.

NSS unit has been continuously striving to volunteer and organising various activities to raise its concern. The year long activities have been efficiently executed by the entire team of the NSS. However the tireless effort and zeal of Utkarsha Khanna and Soumya Malhotra in

mobilizing the students is appreciable. Finally I would like to extend my thanks to my committee members who from time to time have been contributing their efforts and suggestions.

2. - (iv) Educating campus electorate about the electoral process i.e. registration, correction of errors, transportation of names, voting process and ethical voting.

- (v) Facilitating inclusion of Voter Education in various co-curricular activities/festivals of the College Campus through different activities such as Slogan writing, poster making, quiz, debate, essay writing, song, street plays etc.
- (vi) Creating core team of students to work as volunteers for the Systematic Voters Education and Electoral Participation (SVEEP) activities in the college campus.
- (vii) Organising workshops for capacity building in Voter Education among student community.
- (viii) Organising National Voters Day programmes in their respective college campus.
- (ix) Acting as an educator and motivator in family and neighbourhood and helping them in filling registration forms.



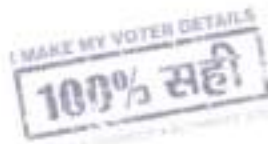

2. Orientations and Capacity Building for compliance of POCSOA 2012
3. Experiential activities and exercises to capture the imagination of the Youth to encourage proactive participation.

In the spirit of active citizenship, these informed NSS volunteers— Champions of Change— in keeping with their Constitutional Right to Equality, will be enabled to practice their role and responsibility as an informed active citizen versus the apathy of an ignorant, passive bystander.

1. the capacity to prevent, prohibit and intervene in instances of sexual offences against children.





CIRCULAR

Outreach and Extension Cell of the college is part of the IQAC which tries to extend its activities to the underprivileged sections of the society. The students participate in different programs so as to enable them to connect with different sections of the society. Along with this sensitization towards gender issues, child labour and domestic violence through exhibitions, workshops and street plays are an integral part of the activities of the committee. Sensitized, aware and committed students look beyond the classrooms to connect with different groups and sections of society. This year the committee has been involved in various activities.

‘Library Every Friday’ is an initiative taken by the Outreach Extension Cell of the college. Library facilities are provided to the children of Nirmal Chhaya (a home providing care to women and girl children rescued from a variety of difficult situations run by the Department of Women and Child Development). The students were divided in two groups, each group has ten volunteers, from different departments of the College and work as a team to collect and lend reading material for young children and conduct reading sessions. The initiative aims at developing reciprocal growth, firstly, by providing facilities to the deprived section and secondly, by helping to inculcate a sense of responsibility and community service.

One Billion Rising Campaign. The college in collaboration with CFAR (Centre for Advocacy and Research) organized a Public Art show on 6th and 7th February, 2017 from 11.00 am to 4.00 pm under OBR (One Billion Rising) campaign. The art exhibition brought together the creative outputs that had emerged from the various workshops that had taken place over the last year as part of the school of project. It was presented on a single platform using photographs, drawings, story boards, graphic stories, newspapers, video spots, slogans and street play performance that traced the challenges and dreams of women and young people faced with gender-based violence, both in and outside their homes. The exhibition provided a space and thoughts about the possibilities that peer-based learning methods create in contesting hegemonic structures. The School of Life tent (30 x 30 ft) was pitched in the Central lawns and exhibition was set up inside it.

Student from the department of Human Development and Family Empowerment performed Mime play on 6th February, 2017 based on the issues of gender discrimination which they also performed at the Central Park of Connaught Place on 5th February, 2017.

Three Day Workshop. A three day workshop was organized by 'School of Life' in collaboration with CFAR. On the **first day**, the workshop focused on Media-The Use of Camera and the knowledge of using it efficiently.

On the **second day**, it started with the focus on gender and its issues with a description of difference between Sex and Gender. It elaborated on the characteristics traits of Girls and boys with reference to the stereotypes set by the society. Later, they initiated an activity of good touch and bad touch focusing the pleasure and pain issue of gender. After that they divided the students' in different groups and gave few topics on gender issues on which the students were asked to prepare scripts to enact.

On the **third day**, Short clips were made with the scripts prepared by the students.

Dwarka Court. A visit was organised to get information regarding court and its followed procedures. There were seven girls from the department of H.D.F.E (accompanied by Mrs. Krishna), adolescent girls and women of Kalyan Puri were a part of this visit. The motive was to find answers to the questions that a typical person comes across while following court procedures. The group attended an interaction session with two of the protection officers and discussed the current concerns of women, how to file a case and procedures related to the same, laws regarding domestic violence and the duration period required for the final judgment of a case, divorce cases and custodians of the child after divorce and so on.

Filmistan. A visit to service provider officer. Eight students were a part of this visit. The visit was focused on issues that a woman face in her family and their possible solutions. They were explained about the ways in which they could handle sensitive situations.

Human Rights Office, Karol Bagh. A trip to the Human Rights Office, Karol Bagh was organized to spread awareness among students about Human Rights, its use and its importance.

Bal Bhawan. The Students of our college took part in sensitizing society about women's issues and they showed four short movie clips, based on gender discrimination, domestic violence, sex offence and molestation which were made in a three-day workshop, and shared their views and concerns about gender sensitization in the society.

A nukkad natak/Street play was enacted by children from Kalyan Puri slums on domestic violence based on the personal experiences of the children in collaboration with society for all round development (SARD). The students participated in an awareness campaign against child labour at Nehru Place.

A talk by Prof Bharati Baveja was organised on issues concerning human resource management in higher education for the faculty and the students.

employer and the child on how important it is for them to attend school and not to engage in work at such a tender age. Students often visited nearby shops and street vendors.

Let no child be deprived of learning with this motto students divided themselves in groups to teach the children of labourers involved at the construction of auditorium in the college . Not only learning was imparted, along with that awareness on observing basic hygiene and importance of cleanliness was also shared.

Students in groups also started visiting Anganwadi located in a slum at Shankar Garden, near to our college to learn while playing. Students would often engage with the kids while playing and helping them to imbibe basic learning skills. At times they would also counsel adolescent girls living in the slums on menstrual hygiene, on psychological and emotional wellbeing.


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

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
