Reports of North -East Society, Bharati College

The 'North -East India' embracing the 8 states (Arunachal Pradesh, Manipur, Mizoram, Assam, Nagaland, Tripura, Meghalaya and Sikkim) well known for its diverse culture, blessed with abundant flora and fauna are referred to by many as NATURE'S ABODE and TRAVELLER'S PRIDE .

The aim of the North-east society is to uncover the diversity of our unique identity and culture and to assimilate every northeast students studying in Delhi University together as brothers and sisters under one umbrella.

Keeping this initiative in mind, the northeast society of BHARATI COLLEGE was established in December, 2018. It comprises of 80 plus students and a convener. The society aims to manifest the rich tradition of north - east India in order to grow closer to the mainland India. True to its culture and tradition, every year the society organizes various events where the students would get opportunity to showcase their talents and also the radiant cultures since its inception.

The FRESHER'S MEET was organized for the batch of 2019-20 on 28th September, 2019 in collaboration with the 6 colleges of West Delhi followed by 'DIWALI MELA' in collaboration with the students' union of Bharati College on 22nd October, 2019.

Embodying faith in academics, the society members enthusiastically participated in various cultural dance competitions organized by different colleges such as DDU, RLA and ARSC. In one of these competitions, the society secured 1st position in BAMBOO DANCE TROUPE at DDU NORTH-EAST FEST on 27th February, 2020. It was indeed a proud moment!

Due to various reasons, the main fest of the society was not able to hold on time but fortunately it was made possible on 4th of March, 2020 showcasing the exotic cuisines and vibrant tribal dances of North-east India. It was an all day long programme in which Senganglu Thaimai , Asst. Professor of Miranda House, English Dept. graced the occasion.
