Drama therapy workshop was conducted by Ms. Shruti Garg for the students and faculties.

Make mentor-mentee programme more effective adopting student-centric approach by providing students flexibility to select mentor of their choice.

Bharati College has implemented an effective mentor-mentee system through our ERP software, where each faculty member is assigned 20 mentees. These mentees can approach their mentors both through the ERP platform and offline to resolve academic and administrative queries. This robust system is supported by detailed documentation, where mentors record their interactions, including time spent and date of the interaction, notes shared, and queries resolved. This information is accessible on the ERP system, allowing students to track their progress and stay informed

Additionally, In 2023, the college upgraded its library services by adopting the KOHA LMS, an open-source system used globally for managing, cataloging, circulation, patron management, and more, offering web-based and cloud access to library information.

Through the Unnat Bharat Abhiyan (UBA), students conducted multiple household surveys to identify and address rural challenges and organized workshops to enhance sustainable development efforts. The NSS unit of Bharati College has actively undertaken a wide range of community outreach initiatives to create a positive impact on society. These include medical camps under Project Ayushmann, visits to marginalized communities like GB Road and Matrichhaya, and workshops such as the UBA (Unnat Bharat Abhiyan) workshops, and a session on transgender

15. Multidisciplinary / interdisciplinary

Bharati college has introduced various programs and courses that bridge multiple disciplines, fostering a holistic educational environment. This approach encourages students to engage with diverse fields, promoting critical thinking and adaptability. Bharati College ensures a multidisciplinary and interdisciplinary curriculum in alignment with the UGCF 2022 guidelines emanating out of the NEP 2020, a path-breaking national education policy to propel our nation to new height in this millennium. The college caters to diverse linguistic preferences, offering courses in Hindi, English, Punjabi and Sanskrit thereby supporting students' educational needs while fostering inclusivity. This approach empowers students to pursue their aspirations without compromising the quality of their academic experience. To promote multidisciplinary approach, the college provides eight subject combinations within its B.A. Programme, enabling students to choose multiple disciplines as cores based on their areas of interest. The students can select a generic elective from 18 options, regardless of their major, encouraging interdisciplinary learning and a broad-based education. The curricular framework is further enriched by 10 Value Added Courses (VACs), 21 Skill Enhancement Courses (SECs), and 6 Ability Enhancement Courses (AECs), equipping students with diverse skills and knowledge. These initiatives ensure a holistic educational experience, preparing students to navigate the contemporary complexities efficiently.

16.Academic bank of credits (ABC):

The National Education Policy (NEP) 2020 has introduced the

concept of Academic Bank of Credit (ABC), a revolutionary initiative to enhance academic flexibility and mobility across Higher Education Institutions (HEIs). This digital framework empowers students to earn, store, and transfer credits seamlessly between institutions and programmes, ultimately enabling them to attain degrees at their convenience. To support this initiative, the Government of India has launched "DIGILOCKER," a secure digital platform for managing academic records, including degrees, certificates, and marksheets. All current and past students are required to create an ABC ID through their respective colleges, which acts as a repository for their credits and academic achievements. This system not only simplifies the credit accumulation process but also promotes lifelong learning by allowing students to re-enter the education system at any point and continue their academic journey. Additionally, the ABC framework aligns with the NEP's 4-year undergraduate program structure, offering students the option to graduate 'with Research.' This distinction requires students to undertake and complete a rigorous research project in their chosen field of study, as defined by their HEI. By integrating ABC and DIGILOCKER, the policy facilitates a learner-centric, multidisciplinary education system, fostering innovation, research, and skill development while ensuring universal access to quality higher education. Taking the cue from the above, Bharati College has adopted the Academic Bank of Credit system, allowing students to accumulate and transfer credits across different programs and institutions.

17.Skill development:

Bharati College emphasizes skill development through workshops, seminars, and practical training sessions. These initiatives aim to equip students with industry-relevant skills, enhancing their employability and readiness for the professional world. with the NEP curriculum framework, Bharati College, IQAC prioritizes skill development to empower learners and enhance their employability.. This is facilitated through Skill Enhancement Courses (SECs) focusing on critical skills such as Financial Literacy, Digital Empowerment, Ayurveda, Front-End Web Design, IT Tools & Skills, Data Analysis, E-Tourism, Content Development, and more. Students engage in Internships, or Community Outreach programs as part of the SEC curriculum. The college also facilitated Carrier Oriented Short-Term Courses, including Diploma Courses in Digital Marketing Tax and Accounting Web Development, in collaboration with various industry partners and institutions like National Institute of Electronics &

Information Technology(NIELIT) and Spoken Tutorial, IIT Bombay. As part of Prime Minister Modi's Skill India Initiative, the college collaborates with Samarth Bharat to offer skill development courses, aiming to harness the potential of India's demographic dividend. A Skill Development Course in Nail Art which denotes self sustainable business model and Bakery course to equip students with essential baking skills, offered in collaboration with Samarth Bharat. This initiative aims to equip students with valuable skills during the summer break, enhancing their entrepreneurial potential and preparing them for future opportunities.

18.Appropriate integration of Indian Knowledge system (teaching in Indian Language, culture, using online course)

The curricular framework ensures appropriate integration of the Indian Knowledge System (IKS) by incorporating teachings in Indian languages, promoting cultural heritage, and leveraging online courses. This approach emphasizes the richness of Indian traditions and wisdom while aligning with modern educational practices, fostering a deeper understanding of India's diverse cultural and linguistic legacy. Sustainability is integral to the college's ethos. Eco-friendly practices, such as gifting Tulsi saplings and Khadi Angvastra during events, highlight its commitment to environmental consciousness. These saplings, cultivated by the college's skilled gardeners, embody selfreliance and sustainability. The college also organizes Hawans and celebrates traditional Indian festivals like Navratri-Dandiya Fest, Diwali Melas, New Year Celebration, Makar Sankranti, Holi, Basant Panchmi, Guru Purab with enthusiasm, fostering a sense of cultural unity and collective joy among students, faculty, and staff. IQAC of Bharati College, integrates Indian knowledge systems, cultural traditions, and sustainable practices into its framework, offering students holistic education that connects them to their roots while preparing them for global challenges.

OBE works by clearly defining the learning outcomes for each subject or course and aligning teaching methods, assessment, and evaluation processes with these outcomes. One of the major benefits of OBE is its ability to better prepare students for the workforce. By focusing

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on the skills and knowledge needed in the modern economy, students are more likely to graduate with the competencies required to contribute effectively to national development. Additionally, OBE promoting a culture of continuous assessment and accountability within the education system. Teachers and administrators can use data from assessments to identify where students are struggling and make necessary adjustments to teaching methods, ensuring that learning outcomes are met.

20.Distance education/online education:

As part of its best practices, the college maximizes resource utilization by conducting Sunday classes for NCWEB and SOL, and offering Postgraduate programs for IGNOU on weekends to promote distance and online education ensures that students receive a holistic education that balances academic and extracurricular activities, preparing them effectively for their future endeavors. The NCWEB Centre of the College fulfills a very important and noble mission of education women who for different reasons are unable to become a part of the regular University system. Over the last year, more than 15 co-curricular activities were organised by the Centre. NCWEB runs B.A. and B.Com courses, accommodating around 400 students per semester, with a total of 1,200 students at any given time. SOL Bharati College has extended its social commitment by establishing the SOL PCP (School of Open Learning - Personal Contact Program) Centre. This initiative has grown to serve approximately 500 students. The centre offers two key undergraduate courses: B.A. (Program) and B. Com (Program). We are one of the best centres of SOL in SOL holds B.A. classes for approximately 600 students per semester, and the college serves as an examination centre for 1,000 SOL students thus catering to students outside our own centre. IGNOU Study center provides M.A. programs in Hindi, English, Economics, Psychology, Political Science, and M. Com, catering to about 2,500 students each semester.

1.1.1 - The Institution ensures effective curriculum delivery through a well planned and documented process

Bharati College, a constituent college with permanent affiliation to the University of Delhi, follows the curriculum prescribed by the University and strictly adheres to its guidelines.

- To ensure effective curriculum delivery, in alignment with the consolidation of the NEP, departmental meetings are conducted before the beginning of each session to decide on course options to be offered to students under DSE, Generic, and SEC courses.
- An extended orientation program is conducted wherein students are explained about these optional papers thoroughly. Master and departmental Time table committees prepare Teacher-Wise, Class-Wise and Room-wise time tables. Faculty members prepare teaching lesson plans for themselves.

- Adequate time has been allotted for curricular and extracurricular activities to ensure holistic and life-oriented learning.
- Mentor-mentee groups are formed, activated and made visible on students' dashboard.
- Subject-experts are invited for interactive sessions with students. Regular small group discussions in tutorials are held to give in depth knowledge to students about the concerned subject.
- Continuous evaluation and internal assessment are used as two main tools to assess if the course has been implemented effectively. The Monitoring Committee is mandated to keep a check on continuous evaluation and internal assessment process.

1.1.2 - The institution adheres to the academic calendar including for the conduct of Continuous Internal Evaluation (CIE)

Bharati College makes adequate efforts to ensure effective teaching-learning process. A detailed academic calendar plan with timelines for syllabus completion, assessments, and activities are prepared. It includes the start and end date of each semester, time period allotted for field work/projects/lectures, co-curricular activities and the internal evaluation schedule.

In the beginning of the session, Principal along with IQAC Coordinator, Examination Committee, monitoring committee lay out a plan of action for the conduct of CIE.

To evaluate students, teachers use different assessment strategies and formats. From the academic year 2022-23, under

the NEP, a new assessment pattern was introduced for the first year, and in 2023-24, it was implemented in the second year. It comprises 30 and 40 marks, respectively, for Internal Assessment (IA) and Continuous Assessment (CA), graded by the university and with internal marks visible to the students on their dashboard (ERP). The remaining 90 marks are designated for the final written examination. While for non-NEP students, the marks obtained by student through overall CIE process comprises of 25% weightage of University grading (25/100) i.e. 75% weightage belongs to final written examination conducted by the University. Once the marks are uploaded, it is visible on the College website for public access.

The College follows a structured evaluation system under the UGCF 2022, aligned with the NEP 2020 framework, emphasizing internal assessment (IA) and continuous assessment (CA) in terms of both frequency and mode. The key highlights of IA mechanism are as follows:

Transparency: Students are informed about IA guidelines via the University website and college prospectus, which outline detailed rules and regulations.

Orientation Programmes: College-wide and departmental orientation sessions introduce students to the evaluation process, with faculty explaining assessment modes and timelines.

Attendance Policy: The SmartProf/ERP portal provides real-time attendance updates to students, showing the percentage of

classes attended. This information is particularly beneficial under NEP, as lecture and tutorial attendance contributes to students' IA and CA scores.

Monitoring Committee: A faculty-led committee ensures consistent evaluation and monitors the process. The committee shares an internal academic calendar with the faculty specifying IA and CA marks uploading deadlines.

Marks sharing via ERP (SmartProf): Faculty evaluate answer scripts, discuss them with students, and upload scores on ERP which the students can see, ensuring transparency and promotes in timely redressal of discrepancies.

Generation of MIS reports: ERP generates MIS reports for attendance and IA/CA marks, aiding higher authorities in performance and attendance analysis.

Through diverse initiatives and dedicated efforts, Bharati

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College promotes innovation, facilitates knowledge transfer, and upholds academic excellence, empowering both students and teaching fraternity to excel.

Bharati College implemented various outreach initiatives over the past year positively impacting the local community. Students played a pivotal role in these endeavours, illustrating a commendable sense of social responsibility. Key activities included:

The College has adopted five neighbouring villages: Possangipur, Tihar, Titarpur, Hastsal, and Chaukhandi. Under Project Ayushman, Medical Camps were regularly organised for village residents.

Facilitated by Sewa Bharati, NSS students visited GB Road to understand the challenges faced by sex workers. Students contributed their services to the medical camp being conducted there at the time.

Bharati College has become a designated collection center of household materials for GOONJ-NGO. Independent donation drives were also held throughout the year.

The NSS and NCC organised blood donation camps in collaboration with the National Thalassemia Welfare Society.

Under Project Akshar, NSS organized a JNU campus visit and conducted CUET PG doubt-clearing sessions and mock tests for students.

Under Project Sambhav, CDF Bharati collaborating with Divine Needs NGO, arranged offline classes for underprivileged children. CDF Bharati provides skill development education to the youth of South-West Delhi as an ongoing activity.

The NSS Unit hosted several debates, screenings and workshops on Voter ID awareness. These activities aimed to promote youth participation in elections.

INFRASTRUCTURE AND LEARNING RESOURCES

4.1 - Physical Facilities

- 4.1.1 The Institution has adequate infrastructure and physical facilities for teaching-learning. viz., classrooms, laboratories, computing equipment etc.
- Efficient infrastructure is at the heart of efforts to meet an institution's sustainable development goals. The Bharati College, which has an approximate area of 8.06 acres, has five blocks for academic and non-academic activities: the Old Block, the New Building, the Auditorium, the Sports Ground, the Common Room and a Residential Hostel for Girls.
- The college has 71 classrooms that meet the tutorial requirements to facilitate students' learning. Of these, 41 are equipped with projectors and Wi-Fi. All rooms are crossventilated, and space utility is managed to conserve electricity and other resources. Learning labs are provided to different departments. This year, the Music department started a lab facility for the students.
- The Sports Centre facilitates outdoor and indoor sports, with a Yoga Centre attached.
- The Library block has two floors of reading rooms and ICT

facilities and is also located on the ground floor of the old academic block.

- The college has a Banking extension counter, Canteen, and student-run cafeteria.
- The medical and Counselling centres work with a female medical officer and a college counsellor to address physical and mental health issues.

4.1.2 - The Institution has adequate facilities for cultural activities, sports, games (indoor, outdoor), gymnasium, yoga centre etc.

The college auditorium, with a seating capacity of approximately 350 and above, is ideally suited for major programs, events, and other activities. It is well-equipped with the latest audiovisual equipment, facilitating the smooth conduct of events. Since 2022, it has become a venue for many academic workshops, seminars and conferences. The hall is fully airconditioned, has Wi-Fi enabled with digital projection, and has the best audio facility. The college's Seminar Hall has a seating capacity of 150. Adjacent to this is the theatre room, which has well-equipped instruments that provide adequate facilities for events at the smaller level. The open-air Central lawn is a perfect spot for various cultural activities in the student societies and their practice and dance performances. It has been a venue for hoisting the national flag during Republic Day and Independence Day celebrations. The sports complex covers an area of approximately 3 acres and above. The Sports Complex also provides a gym and indoor and outdoor sports facility.

Students play Table Tennis, Chess and Badminton, Hockey, Cricket, Kho-Kho and Kabaddi, for which well-laid playfields have been made available. A dedicated yoga centre of the college provides holistic well-being to students and other college members.

Bharati College ensures rigorous review of its financial affairs through various internal and external financial audits. The institution adheres to Government GFRs and complies with all applicable financial rules, regulations and guidelines. Annual accounts and financial estimates for each financial year are prepared as per the guidelines of the University of Delhi. Income/Expenditure is closely monitored by the Principal, Bursar and the Section Officer (Accounts). Most of the funds received for various activities of the College are spent by the concerned Committees after proper authorisations and approvals. The college has a Purchase Committee which invites quotations and compares prices before finalising an order. The Audit Wing of the UGC visits the college periodically and inspects all the relevant files pertaining to financial matters. External Audit of the accounts is carried out by Delhi Government every 2 or 3 years. Statutory audit of accounts and financial statements is also carried out by the Office of Comptroller and Auditor General (CAG) of India periodically after every 4 / 5 years. Utilisation certificates regarding the use of grants from various sources are also examined. Audit objections are addressed with appropriate explanations, and recommended procedural improvements are implemented after approval by the Governing Body.

6.4.3 - Institutional strategies for mobilization of funds and the optimal utilization of resources

Bharati College, being a constituent college of the University of Delhi, receives 95% grant from the UGC and 5% grant from the Government of Delhi. The college collaborates with different agencies, individuals and philanthropic foundations for seeking additional funds in the form of grants, donations or sponsorships. The college well spends the mobilized funds.

The college prepares a budget estimate based on its expenditure which is first sent to the Governing Body for approval and then to the sanctioning authority. All financial transactions require the permission of the Principal and the Bursar. These funds are used to enhance teaching-learning and support infrastructure. Expansion, repair or construction of new facilities in the college can be done only after submission and approval of the University Grants Commission (UGC) and the University of Delhi. The library is upgraded every year according to the required funds. The institution also hosts open learning programmes such as the Non-Collegiate Women's Education Board (NCWEB) through efficient utilization of funds received from the University of Delhi. To promote inclusion, equity and accessibility, the college keeps the annual fee structure to a minimum for the benefit of all students. Fees collected are used for student development activities and facilities such as library services, sports facilities, laboratories and IT infrastructure, seminars, guest lectures, field trips, national and international conferences.

Biodegradable Waste: "Enactus" Bharati College ensures segregation of bio-degradable and non-biodegradable solid waste under project "SORT". The biodegradable solid waste is converted to organic manure in college premises.

Re-purposing of one-side printed papers is ensured in college.

Non-biodegradable waste: In accordance with the Government of India's resolution to ban all single-use plastics, college administration has minimised the use of plastic on campus. Under project PAIRSKAR, CDF and Bisleri partnership collected 367.03 kg plastic waste and transformed it into reusable items. Bisleri supplied CDF BHARATI with dustbins and two benches crafted from recycled plastic waste, emphasizing a commitment to reuse and sustainability. To enhance public awareness and understanding of this recycling process, a Bisleri-sponsored information session was conducted.

E-waste: College maintains proper record of all e-waste and has taken initiative for their disposal. The college has functional Disposal Committee with Prof. Sanjay Chamoli being nominated as a member from University of Delhi working for e-auction of e-waste.

Biomedical waste is managed by incinerators in the campus.

Hazardous chemicals and radioactive wastes are not generated in Bharati college.
