Partition of India: Displacement, Identities, and Resettlement

The Partition of India in 1947 was a political decision that redrew borders, but millions of ordinary people bore the true cost. Behind the maps and speeches lay a heart-wrenching human tragedy of displacement, shattered identities, and painful resettlements. My father, then just a young student in Class 8, arrived from Lahore with "khali haath—nange pair" (empty hands — barefoot). He, like countless others, faced unimaginable hardship in a land that was supposed to be his own.

He would often speak of Master Tara Singh, whose fiery slogans and actions fuelled communal sentiments, but he would also fondly recall Lahore—its culture, language, and warmth. His voice would quiver with emotion when he repeated the saying: "Jinne Lahore nahi wekhya, o jamiya hi nahi" (One who hasn't seen Lahore hasn't truly been born). It wasn't just a city—it was home. To leave one's home, roots, and memories behind is a wound that rarely heals.

The refugees who arrived in India had to rebuild their lives from scratch, often facing alienation and being labelled outsiders in a country they now called home. Their identity shifted overnight: from citizens to "refugees."

But amid the suffering, stories of resilience rose, of rebuilding with courage and dignity.

Today, as we reflect on Partition, let us remember it not merely as a political event but as a deeply human crisis. We owe this freedom to the generations who bore its scars, ensuring that peace and humanity triumph over politics.

Bharati College, in collaboration with the Centre for the Study of Independence and Partition (CIPS), University of Delhi, and jointly hosted by the Departments of Political Science and Punjabi, organized a One-Day National Seminar titled "Borders and Boundaries: Displacement, Identity and Resettlement" on April 15, 2025. The seminar began with a solemn candle-lighting ceremony and the University of Delhi's Kulgeet, setting a reflective tone. Prof. Saloni Gupta, Principal of Bharati College, inaugurated the event with a heartfelt welcome address, sharing her connection to Partition through her father's journey from Lahore, highlighting the resilience and emotional depth of migration narratives.



Keynote speakers included:

- Prof. Ravinder Kumar (Director, CIPS), who termed Partition as the "Indian Holocaust" and emphasized the enduring scars of displacement.
- Prof. Shri Prakash Singh (Director, South Campus, DU) stressed the importance of preserving oral histories.
- Dr. Swapan Dasgupta (Renowned journalist and former Rajya Sabha MP), who reflected on refugee experiences and the formation of new identities post-Partition.
- A panel discussion followed, chaired by Prof. Himanshu Prasad Roy (JNU), featuring:
- Dr. Varun Gulati (DU), who critiqued colonial strategies that led to Partition.
- Prof. Amrit Kaur Basra (DCAC), who advocated for reclaiming forgotten voices, especially from Punjab.
- Dr. Bhuwan Jha (DU), who explored the ideological roots of the Partition.
- The seminar concluded with an engaging Q&A session and a formal vote of thanks by Prof. Jyoti Trehan Sharma (Joint Director, CIPS).

The seminar offered a significant platform for academic engagement and emotional remembrance, emphasizing the ongoing relevance of Partition in shaping contemporary South Asian identities and geopolitics. Bharati College remains committed to nurturing such critical conversations and historical inquiries.

कार्यशाला:"प्रशासनिक कार्यों में राजभाषा हिंदी का प्रयोग"

29 अप्रैल. 2025: भारती कॉलेज (दिल्ली विश्वविद्यालय) में दिनांक 29 अप्रैल. 2025 को "प्रशासनिक कार्यों में राजभाषा हिंदी का प्रयोग" विषय पर एक महत्वपूर्ण हिंदी कार्यशाला का आयोजन किया गया। इस कार्यशाला का उद्देश्य शैक्षणिक व प्रशासनिक कार्यों में हिंदी भाषा के प्रभावी प्रयोग को प्रोत्साहित करना था। इस अवसर पर मुख्य अतिथि के रूप में श्री जगदीश राम पौडी, निदेशक, राजभाषा, शिक्षा मंत्रालय, भारत सरकार उपस्थित रहे। कार्यक्रम की अध्यक्षता कॉलेज की प्राचार्या प्रो. सलोनी गुप्ता ने की। कार्यक्रम की शुरुआत एक सौहार्दपूर्ण वातावरण में हुई, जहाँ प्राचार्या प्रो. सलोनी गुप्ता ने मुख्य अतिथि श्री जगदीश राम पौड़ी का स्वागत एक पौधा भेंट कर किया, जो पर्यावरण संरक्षण और सत्कार भावना का प्रतीक रहा। इसके पश्चात कार्यशाला में भाग लेने वाले सभी प्रतिभागियों ने अपना संक्षिप्त परिचय दिया, जिसमें उन्होंने अपना नाम, विभाग और कॉलेज में कार्य करने का अनुभव साझा किया। यह परिचय सत्र बेहद रोचक रहा, क्योंकि इसमें कॉलेज के विभिन्न विभागों जैसे हिंदी, पंजाबी, पत्रकारिता, वाणिज्य, पुस्तकालय, लेखा और प्रशासन से जुड़े सभी सदस्यों ने भाग लिया। इस विविधता को देखकर मुख्य अतिथि ने विशेष प्रसन्नता व्यक्त की और इसे कॉलेज की एक सकारात्मक विशेषता बताया।

इसके बाद, कार्यशाला का मुख्य सत्र आरंभ हुआ, जिसमें श्री जगदीश राम पौड़ी ने भारती कॉलेज द्वारा राजभाषा हिंदी को बढ़ावा देने के लिए किए गए प्रयासों की सराहना की। उन्होंने कहा कि कॉलेज परिसर में किए गए छोटे-छोटे बदलाव स्पष्ट रूप से दिखते हैं और ये बदलाव हिंदी भाषा के प्रचार में एक बड़ी भूमिका निभा रहे हैं। उन्होंने यह भी सुझाव दिया कि हमें विद्यार्थियों में हिंदी में पुस्तक पढ़ने की संस्कृति को विकसित करना चाहिए, जिससे भाषा के प्रति रुचि और जुड़ाव बढ़े। श्री पौड़ी ने राजभाषा से संबंधित संविधान के अनुच्छेद 343(1) का उल्लेख करते हुए यह बताया कि हिंदी को हमारे देश की राजभाषा के रूप में संवैधानिक मान्यता प्राप्त है। उन्होंने यह प्रश्न भी रखा कि पहला हिंदी दिवस कब मनाया गया था, और फिर उससे जुड़ी महत्वपूर्ण जानकारी भी साझा की।

आगे उन्होंने राजभाषा नियमों, हिंदीभाषी, अर्ध-हिंदीभाषी और गैर-हिंदीभाषी राज्यों की पहचान व विशेषताओं पर भी प्रकाश डाला। उन्होंने अपने अनुभवों के आधार पर '4D सूत्र' प्रस्तुत किया – Desire (इच्छा), Direction (दिशा), Dedication (समर्पण) और Discipline (अनुशासन)। उनका मानना है कि यदि इन चार बातों को अपनाया जाए तो प्रशासनिक कार्यों में राजभाषा हिंदी का प्रभावी प्रयोग निश्चित रूप से संभव है, और यह प्रक्रिया हमारे लक्ष्य की ओर एक सुखद और सफल यात्रा बन सकती है।

कार्यशाला का एक विशेष आकर्षण वह संवादात्मक सत्र रहा, जिसमें उपस्थित प्राध्यापकों और कर्मचारियों ने विभिन्न विचार और सुझाव साझा किए। कुछ प्रतिभागियों ने सुझाव दिया कि विद्यार्थियों में हिंदी के प्रति रुचि बढ़ाने के लिए विभिन्न प्रतियोगिताएं आयोजित की जाएं। वहीं, कुछ ने कॉलेज पुस्तकालय में हिंदी और अंग्रेज़ी दोनों भाषाओं में साहित्य उपलब्ध कराने का सुझाव दिया तािक छात्र-छात्राएं दोनों भाषाओं में अध्ययन कर सकें। इस कार्यशाला ने न केवल हिंदी भाषा के प्रशासनिक प्रयोग की दिशा में जागरूकता बढ़ाई, बल्कि यह भी दिखाया कि भाषा के माध्यम से हम सभी एक-दूसरे से और अधिक सशक्त रूप से जुड़ सकते हैं। प्रतिभागियों के लिए यह कार्यशाला एक प्रेरणादायक, ज्ञानवर्धक और विचारोत्तेजक अनुभव रही।

UPSC Unplugged: Secrets to Success Revealed!

Bharati College, University of Delhi, hosted its annual academic event Utkarsh'25, organized by Dhairya, The Civil Services Society, from April 16-17. The two-day event blended competitive activities with engaging discussions on governance and public service. Day one featured events designed to spark ethical reasoning and critical thinking. On day two, keynote speaker Mr. Sanjeev Chopra, senior bureaucrat and former LBSNAA Director, addressed challenges in governance, including the upcoming Census, urban-rural representation shifts, and linguistic diversity. Quoting Lal Bahadur Shastri's "Aspire, Assert, Adjust," he stressed adaptability in public service. A panel discussion followed with IRS officer Mr. Rajesh Gupta and Prof. Vinay Nangia, former UPSC Board Member. Mr. Gupta shared administrative experiences, emphasizing bureaucrats as change agents, not just rule-followers. She emphasized mutual respect, ongoing dialogue, and institutional accountability. Tools such as the 'She Box' for filing complaints online were introduced, along with detailed insights into the ICC's role and processes rooted in integrity and transparency. Participants reflected on power dynamics, reporting structures, and the shared responsibility of all staff members in fostering a harassment-free workplace. The event reaffirmed the college's commitment to creating a secure, respectful work culture. Teachers expressed that they felt more informed and empowered about their rights following the session.
